The Museum is open six days a week at 1301 Hudson St., in the Shipyard building, the oldest structure still standing on Hoboken’s storied waterfront.

**Sun., Mar. 25, 2 – 5 p.m., Opening reception for *Beautiful Downtown Hoboken: Photographs from the 1970s***, color photographs by Virginia Rolston Parrott, in the Upper Gallery. Free.

**Tues., Mar. 27, 7:30 p.m., Hoboken Garden Club lecture:** Michael Ruggiero, “New and Interesting Perennials and Annuals.” At the Museum, free for HGC and Museum members; \$5 for nonmembers.

**Thurs., Apr. 12, 10 a.m., Uptown Storytime at the Museum** for children ages 18 months to 5 years and their caregivers. Free.

**Sat., Apr. 14, 1 – 4 p.m., The Great Hoboken Tea Party**, at Teak on the Hudson, 16 Hudson Place, featuring a talk on the history of tea by Lipton’s master tea taster, Peter F. Goggi, president of the Royal Estates division, plus tea and hors d’oeuvres. \$30 for Museum members and advance-purchase; \$35 for nonmembers and same-day tickets.

**Sat., Apr. 14, 5 p.m., “Truth, Lies, Secrets,” a showcase of short films and video works** by URBAN IMAGE, a collective of media artists based at New Jersey City University. At the Museum, \$5 suggested donation.

**Sun., Apr. 15, 4 p.m., *From Another Time* lecture:** Photographer **Virginia Rolston Parrott** will share slides she took in the 1970s around Hoboken and along the Hudson River waterfront. Free.

**Tues., Apr. 17, 7:30 p.m., Hoboken Garden Club photo workshop,** part one: “A Beginner’s Look at Taking Better Pictures.” At the Museum, free for HGC and Museum members; \$5 for nonmembers.

**Sun., Apr. 22, 4 p.m., *From Another Time* lecture:** Artist **Hugh Kilmer** will discuss the Hoboken arts scene in the 1970s. Free.

**Sat., Apr. 28, 5:30 p.m., Annual Great Hoboken Auction,** Shipyard Park, 13<sup>th</sup> & Shipyard Lane. Live auction gets underway at 7 p.m. Admission: \$10.
