#### BLOOMFIELD TO GARDEN

#### NORTH SIDE

- 158 2X3 italianate which is almost wholly intact (with exception of gate on fence). 1st story aluminum storm windows. Intact segmental arch lintels, arched frieze panels between cornice console brackets.
- 160-62 2 matching 3X2 row houses with segmented arch lintels. First story in each has paired segmented arch window under large lintel. Only inside door and fence of 160 are intact. console brackets in cornice.

#### SOUTH SIDE

- 157 3X3 italianate with intact flat lintels, cornice. (intact doors?)
- 159 wide 3X3 italianate intact, although 2 left cornice consoles are decayed. Intact outer door.
- 163-5 1 story garage 2 door yellow brick flared concrete pieces at top ends.

- 204 1 story storefront cornice intact behind plywood cover
- 206-12 four 3X3 italianate row houses with intact segmental arche lintels and wood console bracketed and denticulated cornices. Intact cast iron rail and fence at 208. Altered 1st story window at 212 but old lintels remain all have basement entries under front steps.

- 201 Joseph E. Brandt School (Public School #2) C. 1910 Classical Revival - Commercial

- 254 1 story intact storefront bars on windows Torna Pizzeria
- 256 2X3 brick veneer with garage in 1st story

- 262 1 story garage stuccoed to look like concrete block
